On Sunday 4th February 2018, a busload of our members and friends attended a commemoration service at The Australian Ex-Prisoners of War Memorial in Ballarat Victoria. The Memorial acknowledges the hardship, deprivation, brutality, starvation and disease endured by Prisoners of War during their capture and the scars many continued to endure upon their repatriation to Australia. The Memorial lists 27 Greek-Australians Prisoners from World War Two, including 9 who died as prisoners. Following the service, we had our picnic at the magnificent Ballarat Botanical Gardens located on the shore of Lake Wendourie.

I met WW2 veteran Anthony Miller (Moulroudakis)..... By Steve Kyritsis





Commemoration of the New Zealand Servicemen during the WW2 Greek Campaign



On the 4th March 2018, The Australian Hellenic Memorial Foundation conducted a commemoration service to honour the New Zealand service personnel that sacrificed their lives in Greece during World War Two. Of the 7,700 New Zealanders in Greece, 1,041 paid the supreme sacrifice and over 2,000 became interned as POWs. The New Zealand casualty rate was the highest of the Allied forces, mainly from their tenacity and willingness to defend Greece as they had come to think of the Greeks as their "brothers".



Gordon DevereauxWhite

In the previous edition of Apostratos, we sadly advised the passing of World War II Navy Veteran Gordon White, aged 97. Because he served in the Greek Campaign 1940-41, Gordon was often seen at many Hellenic RSL Commemorative events.

In this article, Steve Kyritsis gives a brief and personal account of Gordon's WW2 experiences aboard the HMAS Sydney (II). The full story features in Steve Kyritsis' book:-

Greek-Australians in the Australian Armed Forces WW1 & WW2





Gordon joined the Australian light Cruiser HMAS Sydney (II) on 14th September 1938 as a 17 year old Ordinary Seaman Second Class. Gordon's thirty months on the Sydney were spent in the Gunnery section as the Gunnery Officer's Messenger, as he was said to have a sharp mind and a good eye. During late 1939 and early 1940, Sydney was based in Fremantle WA, was engaged in patrolling shipping routes and in convoy escort duties. Gordon sailed with HMAS Sydney to the Mediterranean in April 1940. He was promoted to Able Seaman in May of that year.

HMAS Sydney, with Gordon White in the Director Control Tower, was involved in many engagements in the Mediterranean. Perhaps the most famous of these were the actions involving the Italian cruisers Bartolomeo, Colleoni and Giovanni Delle Bande in the Battle of Cape Spada. The battle occurred when an Allied squadron, including the HMAS Sydney, were patrolling the Aegean Sea and encountered two Italian cruisers transferring from Tripoli to Leros, at that time an Italian colony in the Dodecanese Islands. The sinking of the Calleoni was a famous victory for The Sydney.

In November 1940, The Sydney departed from Alexandria harbour with British troops heading towards Suda Bay Crete Greece who were destined to fight in the Battle of Crete. Around the 8th December, from Suda Bay, The Sydney sailed to Piraeus, the port of Athens and then continued to operate in Mediterranean waters. Eventually, orders were given for it to return to Australia for repairs and maintenance.



HMAS Sydney (II)

On the 19th November 1941 The HMAS Sydney engaged and battled the German auxiliary cruiser Kormoran off the coast of Western Australia. Both ships were destroyed in the half-hour engagement.

From 24th November, after Sydney failed to return to port, air and sea searches were conducted. Boats and rafts carrying survivors from the Kormoran were recovered at sea, while others made landfall north of Carnarvon WA. 318 of the 399 personnel on Kormoran survived. While debris from Sydney was found, there were no survivors from the 645-strong complement. It was the largest loss of life in the history of the Royal Australian Navy, the largest Allied warship lost with all hands during World War II.

So how did Gordon White survive? Fate was on his side, he wasn't on the Sydney at the time, but in the local hospital recovering from a severe illness. Many years later, Gordon always told me, he kept thinking about the fellow who replaced him as Gunnery Officer's Messenger.

Twelve years ago, I had the great pleasure of meeting Gordon at our Hellenic RSL St Kilda Town Hall Function, to Commemorate the WW2 Greek Campaign and the Battle of Crete. Over the years, I would often drop by to visit him and we had many good conversations over a cup of tea.

The last time I saw Gordon, he was in hospital. I found him asleep. I sat in a chair for ten minutes, waiting for him to wake up so we could chat. But he kept sleeping. I quietly told him that I would drop by to see him another day. Gordon passed away two days later.



To all of Gordon's extended family, on behalf of the Hellenic RSL Sub-Branch Melbourne, our sincere condolences for your great loss.

77th Anniversary of the 1941 Battle of Crete at the Hellenic Memorial



On Saturday 26th May 2018, The Battle of Crete & Greece Commemorative Council along with help from The Cretan Brotherhood of Melbourne, Melbourne's Cretan Association and the Cretan Federation of Australia and New Zealand hosted the official parade and wreath laying ceremony at the forecourt of the Shrine of Remembrance and at the Australian Hellenic Memorial with hundreds of people turning out to pay their respects and over fifty wreaths laid. Some 17,000 Australians fought in mainland Greece and Crete and 646 were lost. More than half of these Anzacs were not found or their remains identified.


